Opening the Door to a Special Relationship with UK

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's tour to the United Kingdom from November 12-14 was the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister in almost a decade. Prime Minister Modi's visit to UK was aimed at consolidating ties and outlining a roadmap towards advancing partnership and deepening cooperation between the two countries.



The Royal Air Force marked the moment of Prime Minister Modi's arrival with a flypast in the Indian tri-colours, making India the first foreign country to have its flag colours flown in a British flypast.

During the three day visit, Prime Minister Modi held talks with British Prime Minister, David Cameron, paid homage to the statue of Mahatma Gandhi at Parliament Square, addressed a distinguished group of parliamentarians and eminent persons at the iconic Royal Gallery in the British Parliament, becoming the first head of Indian government to do so; addressed the City of London at the symbolic Guildhall, interacted with the CEOs at the India-UK CEOs Forum, called on Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II unveiled the statue of Lord Basaveshwara, inaugurated the Ambedkar Memorial at the house where Dr B R Ambedkar lived while studying at LSE (London School of Economics) and visited Tata Jaguar Land Rover vehicle manufacturing unit in Solihull.

With a focus on the 3 Ds - Democracy, Demography and Demand and its movement towards E-entrepreneurship, the visit also saw commercial deals worth £9.3 bn being sealed and the two sides releasing a vision document that captured the essence of shared history and a natural partnership, poised to take giant strides forward.

The United Kingdom reaffirmed its continued support for India's permanent membership of an expanded UNSC and India's enhanced role in other international bodies and membership of International Export Control Regimes.

Founding President of Namibia Dr. Sam Nujoma visits India

Founding President of Namibia Dr. Sam Nujoma visited India from 17-22 November 2015. He met Vice President of India Shri Hamid Ansari in New Delhi on November 17, 2015. A Programme 'Dr. Sam Nujoma in Conversation' was organised at India International Centre, Max Mueller Marg on 18 November 2015 in his honour.



The visit of Dr. Nujoma to India took place at the invitation of Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) under their Distinguished Visitor's Programme. The delegation of Dr. Nujoma also included the Vice Chancellor of University of Namibia and other senior officials. Apart from New Delhi, the delegation also visited Chandigarh and Pune.

ITEC DAY celebrated in Windhoek

The Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation Day (ITEC) Day was celebrated in Windhoek over cocktails and dinner at the High Commission of India on 26 November 2015. Deputy Minister of International Relations & Cooperation Hon. Dr. Peya Mushelenga graced the occasion as Chief Guest. Among other dignitaries from the Government of Namibia were Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Higher Education, Innovation & Training as well as Director(Training), Ministry of Defence. A large number of ITEC and ICCR alumni participated in the event.



The Alumni meet started with the ceremonial lighting of lamp by High Commissioner Shri Kumar Tuhin and the Chief Guest. In this address, the High Commissioner highlighted the philosophy behind ITEC, mentioning that several hundred Namibian participants have so far benefitted from this programme. Deputy Minister Hon

Peya Mushelenga in his speech urged the Namibian participants to make full use of the opportunity provided by the Government of India.



The opening address of Hon. President of Namibia H.E Dr. Hage Geingob at the India Africa Forum Summit – III in New Delhi delivered on 28 October 2015 was screened on the occasion. This was followed by the screening of a documentary on ITEC and two films entitled *India – Africa Partnership for Progress* and *Bonding with Africa*.



The evening also saw some distinguished ITEC/ICCR Alumni share their success stories and India experience with the gathering. The evening was a culinary delight for the Namibian guests, with Indian cuisine being served for dinner.

DIWALI FESTIVAL celebrated in Windhoek



The Indian Community in Namibia congregated from all over the country in Windhoek to celebrate the festival of lights, Diwali, on 7 November 2015 at the High Commission of India. The cultural evening saw
