PRIME MINISTER CHAIRS 13TH BRICS SUMMIT

Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired the 13th BRICS Summit virtually on September 09, 2021. The theme of the Summit, chosen by India, was, BRICS@15: Intra-BRICS Cooperation for Continuity, Consolidation and Consensus. The Summit saw the participation of all other BRICS Leaders - President Jair Bolsonaro of Brazil, President Vladimir Putin of Russia, President Xi Jinping of China, and President Cyril Ramaphosa of South Africa.



Prime Minister expressed his appreciation for the cooperation received from BRICS partners during India's Chairship this year, which allowed the achievement of several new initiatives. These included the first BRICS Digital Health Summit; the first BRICS Ministerial Joint Statement on multilateral reforms; a BRICS Counter-Terrorism Action Plan; an Agreement on cooperation in field of remote-sensing satellites; a virtual BRICS vaccine Research & Development Centre; BRICS Alliance on Green Tourism, etc.

Highlighting the leading role that BRICS countries can play in the post-COVID global recovery, Prime Minister called for enhanced BRICS cooperation under the motto of 'Build-back Resiliently, Innovatively, Credibly and Sustainably'. The leaders also discussed important regional and global issues, including recent developments in Afghanistan. There was convergence of views on the threat posed by growth of terrorism and extremism, and all BRICS partners agreed to accelerate implementation of the BRICS Action Plan on Counter-Terrorism. At the conclusion of the Summit, the leaders adopted the 'New Delhi Declaration'.

VISIT OF PRIME MINISTER TO USA FOR QUAD LEADERS' SUMMIT AND UN GENERAL ASSEMBLY (UNGA)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited USA on September 22-25, 2021. During the visit, Prime Minister participated in Quad Summit, he addressed the 76th session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA), he held bilateral meetings with the President and Vice-President of USA, he also held meetings with various global business heads.

On September 24, President Biden hosted Prime Minister Scott Morrison of Australia, Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India, and Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga of Japan at the White House for the first-ever in-person Leaders' Summit of the the Quadrilateral Framework (Quad) in Washington D.C.



The leaders have put forth ambitious initiatives that deepen ties and advance practical cooperation on 21st century challenges: ending the COVID-19 pandemic, including by increasing production and access to safe and effective vaccines; promoting high-standards infrastructure; combatting the climate crisis; partnering on emerging technologies, space, and cyber security; and cultivating next-generation talent in all of our countries.

On 25 September 2021, Prime Minister addressed the High Level segment of the 76th session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA). The theme for 76th UNGA debate was "Building resilience through hope to recover from Covid-19, rebuild sustainably, respond to the needs of the planet, respect the rights of people and revitalize the United Nations".

In his speech, Prime Minister touched upon several important issues confronting the international community today. Representing the Mother of Democracy and based on his own experiences, Prime Minister affirmed that democracy can deliver, democracy has delivered.



Prime Minister cautioned against regressive thinking and extremism, and proposed science-based, rational and progressive thinking. He stated further that using terrorism as a political tool would backfire on those practicing it. On Afghanistan, Prime Minister called for Afghan soil not to be used by terrorists. Nor should Afghanistan's predicament be taken advantage of by other states. The world has an obligation to Afghan women, children and minorities. As the leading voice of the developing world, Prime Minister's address at the High-Level Segment of the 76th UNGA provided an opportunity to project India's views on a range of issues from Covid-19 and vaccine equity, international terrorism, Afghanistan, international peace and security, reformed multilateralism and sustainable development.

HIGH COMMISSIONER PAID A COURTESY CALL ON PRESIDENT HAGE G. GEINGOB

High Commissioner H.E. Prashant Agrawal paid a courtesy call on the President of Republic of Namibia H.E. Dr Hage G. Geingob at State House in Windhoek on September 14, 2021. The High Commissioner was accompanied by First Secretary Mohammad Afsar and Head of Chancery Vipul Bawa.



High Commissioner applauded the leadership of H.E. the President and resilience of Namibian people in fighting COVID-19 and recalled the expression of solidarity in tackling the pandemic together conveyed by H.E. the President of India to H.E. Dr. Geingob earlier. Underlining the close historic ties between the two countries, he also briefed H.E. the President on new initiatives and emerging areas of bilateral collaboration, especially in the context of India's 75th Independence Anniversary commemorations and opportunities in trade, commerce, new technologies & innovation.
